

Agenda questions

Are you happy in school?
Yes- pupils who in the previous term had felt anxious about a class change, now felt happy.
Do you feel safe in school?
Yes- pupils who did not feel safe last term due to a specific pupil, now felt safe as a result of the changes that had been put in place.
Is there anywhere in school that you do not feel safe? Why? Who have you told?
Most pupils said no. Some pupils said they felt less safe in spaces where they felt the visibility was not as good due to lack of CCTV- for example around the fire escape area. Some pupils felt as though there were less adults in this space when they are supporting on the field.
Have you been bullied? How did the school deal with it?
No In one class, some pupils said that there were repeated incidents with another pupils, upon observation this is as a result of social understanding. Staff, including ELT, are aware of this .

Issues to be addressed this term

Issue	Actions to be taken- by who?	Information to be shared (following actions)
Pupils would like more board games to be available in the top corridor at lunchtimes.	Amanda- seeking board games during transitions to be kept in class at lunchtime.	Uno now played in Amanda's class. Now have some board games collected. Have requested further board games. Pupils can play games together in AH class at lunchtime.
Some pupils said that learning was childish, particularly older pupils in relation to RWI lessons.	Amanda fed back to class teachers. Adventurers teachers met and checked through slides for schemes used.	

	Discussion had with English lead regarding suitability of Literacy and Language resources for oldest pupils- these pupils are leaving the school in June. May need to review for future groups.	
Pupils said they would like to have opportunities for different trips, instead of the same trips from previous years.	Amanda, Toby and Anne build this in to planning the trips for the following year.	Different trips are planned in next year, with River Dart being repeated following the success of it this year.
Some pupils wanted more variety of books for book corners and for them to be changed more frequently. Suggested book exchange. Some pupils wanted more non-fiction books linked to their specific interests.		

Possible issues to be addressed in future terms

- More music lessons for more pupils- new plan in place for Term 4, including additional interventions- has this started
- Pupils wanted more opportunities to learn about comic books, animation/ anime and how to use computers, and develop their skills in Art to be able to do this. (suggested use of FlipaClip app already used by the school).

Things raised, not to be actioned -

- Pupils wanted a larger range of clubs, increase in walking/ cycling, including some clubs such as use of computers.
- Pupils wanted more equipment on the field. April update: awaiting for the space to be measured when the spider net is fitted into the primary playground to check what equipment is viable.
